Children Live With Irony Too

By contrast, the debt on properties in more affluent, lower-tax areas, like Barrington Hills and Winnetka, falls below 10% of the value of the properties in those locations.

These new calculations are available at cookcountytreasurer.com, where property owners can click the purple box on the homepage and search their address to see their local debt burden compared to the value of their home in both dollar and percentage amounts.

The new methodology also allowed Pappas to better compare the overall debt burdens borne by residents of any Cook County city or village. That exercise revealed the burden of local government debt varies greatly, with generally heavier burdens in less-affluent suburbs where the populations are more than 50% Black or Latino. The taxes tend to be much higher in many of those minority areas, an indication that more debt leads to higher property taxes.

"Property purchases in Cook County come with a hidden credit card balance, in the form of local government debt," Pappas said. "Property owners end up paying down that debt, on top of also covering their mortgage, utility and maintenance costs."

Sheriff Rescue Unit Locates 1000th Youth

The Cook County Sheriff's Police Child Rescue Unit located its 1,000th missing youth in care on Wednesday, announced Cook County Sheriff Thomas J. Dart.

"Youth in the state's care who are missing are extremely vulnerable to trafficking, drugs and violence," said Sheriff Dart. "We must do everything in our power to try and locate them, protect them and help them succeed in life. They are our children too."

Dart created a specialized unit in 2012 to look for missing youth in the care of the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services as he also called for a state audit into how the agency was handling missing and abducted children. The results of that audit revealed that previous DCFS administrations often failed to report missing youth in a timely manner and sometimes were not reported at all.

The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children reports one in six endangered runways in America to be likely sex trafficking victims. As of May 25th, there were more than 150 missing youth in care with outstanding judicial orders to find them.

In 2016, DCFS welfare specialists began partnering with Sheriff's Police under the Child Rescue Unit to locate missing youth in care - a first-of-its-kind unit in the state to address the problem. The CRU also assists the Chicago Children's Advocacy Center and provides human trafficking awareness training to social services agencies throughout the county.

The most recent youth in care located by the CRU were two girls, ages



June 19th Reopening For Cultural Center



The Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events announced the historic restoration of the landmark Chicago Cultural Center, 78 E. Washington street, to reclaim two lost interiors decorated by the Tiffany Glass and Decorating Company: the Grand Army of the Republic Memorial Hall and Rotunda.

The museum-quality restoration of the art glass dome and decorative finishes is made possible by a generous grant of services valued at \$15,425,000 to the City. The Chicago Cultural Center is home to two magnificent stained-glass domes; the restoration of the Tiffany dome in Preston Bradley Hall was completed in 2008. Restoration work will continue until early 2022.

The grant provides access to a specialized team that are qualified to undertake the restoration. An intricate process will expose the original 1890s surfaces by methodically separating layers of paint. The project also includes the conservation of a 40-foot diameter, 62,000-piece art glass dome that will return natural light that has been blocked since a renovation in the 1930s. Long-lost lighting fixtures that were custom designed for the rooms will be recreated using early photographs and original architectural drawings.

When completed next year, the rooms will reflect their historic appearance, but also facilitate a wider range of free and diverse cultural programming. This includes upgraded lighting, electrical, Wi-Fi and opportunities for artists and organizations to provide a variety of performances and exhibitions.

This project is part of Culture in My Neighborhood, a new collaborative initiative that supports cultural programming at the Chicago Cultural Center, 18 Chicago Park Dis-

trict neighborhood cultural centers, and the Chicago Public Library regional libraries through grants and commission opportunities for artists and organizations.

This program complements an over \$40 million capital investment that will break ground in 2021 in the City's network of cultural centers to upgrade theater, music, dance, and visual art presentation capabilities. Artists and organizations will receive financial support — including those who were displaced by the pandemic, and community residents will enjoy free and affordable, cultural experiences in their own neighborhoods.

The Chicago Cultural Center is open daily from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. with the exhibitions "Jeremiah Hulsebos Spofford: League of Nations" and "what flies but never lands." "Chicago: Where Comics Came to Life, 1880–1960" will open on June 19th.

Visitors will also be greeted with new visitor amenities including a reimagined Welcome Center and Learning Lab — and Buddy, a new shop created with the Public Media Institute (online for now at hi-buddy.org) to give artists and small manufacturers a place to showcase and sell their goods and artwork.
